We acknowledge your concerns, and we understand that this decision may be disappointing and frustrating, but we wanted to clarify the rationale behind it.

Our primary responsibility lies with our readers and the wider scientific community. As a scientific publisher, it is our obligation to thoroughly investigate all concerns brought to our attention and to act accordingly. We understand your desire for further discussion on the matter beyond our original correspondence, however, we must prioritise the reliability and integrity of the content published with Frontiers and take timely action where we deem it necessary. In addition, Chief Editors must stand over all the publications in their journal or specialty and thus addressing their concerns before publication is required.

Given the concerns raised by the Specialty Chief Editor, these would have to be resolved before we can proceed with publication. Should you address the concerns raised by the Specialty Chief Editor, the manuscript can be reinstated and will be reconsidered for publication in Frontiers in Psychology.

In the meantime, the APC will be fully refunded to you and the manuscript will be rejected. You will shortly receive a notification regarding this.

We thank you for your cooperation in this matter and apologise for any inconvenience caused.
